Final papers should not exceed 10,000 words. Although you can refer to technical academic literature, try to keep your contribution as accessible as possible to a more general audience. This applies especially to economists. If you have to use models, or complicated computational and statistical techniques put them in an appendix, and explain the logic in words in the main text.

With regard to your presentation, keep it short and simple. Authors will have about 15' to present their papers in most cases, so that there is time for discussion.

We plan to approach a major publisher in order to have the proceedings of the conference published in book form. We shall use the material that you send us, such as abstracts and short bios to approach a suitable publisher, as we intend to produce a book in both English and (hopefully) Greek.

Please confirm your attendance by the 22nd of March 2019, sending us the exact title of your presentation, a 100 word abstract, a portrait photo and a short biographical note to include in the material that will be distributed to the conference participants.
